HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CEO

1

Celebrating 10 years of Message South Africa was a significant moment for our team, and to top it all off we hosted one of our best Message Nights to date.

2

Our partnership with Word of Life was another highlight, our Genetik Sessions Day Camp and Hubs worked well with the SMASH team from Jozi.

3

Our partnership with Scripture Union was another highlight, we initiated a Youth training course called "Training Youth Leaders Together" or TYLT. Together we trained up 27 leaders who represented 8 different churches across the province.

Through Creative Mission we had 17 000 engagements with young people. This was a massive encouragement to the team, as it's the most engagements we've had of this nature since Covid.

5

Our Prisons and Enterprise team trained up 40 people through Job readiness training and from that group trained up 15 Baristas. My highlight is that 80% of these trained have found meaningful employment.

Our Run100Give100 fundraiser was an amazing team initiative led by our brilliant Operations team. It was so encouraging to see so many of our partners engage in this campaign.



A WORD FROM SHAUN, MESSAGE TRUST CEO

Holding onto Hope, what a fitting theme for 2024. While reflecting on the scripture verse of the theme, found in Hebrews 10:23, the latter part of this rings true... "He who promised is faithful".

In 2024 we got to celebrate 10 years of God's faithfulness toward us as an organisation, and what encouraged me was that God continues to work in and through us, as we love and serve our beautiful city and country.

This was another year for the books, we saw a massive increase in our missional engagement across the city. For the first time, since before covid, our team were able to reach over 17 000 young people through face-to-face engagements across South Africa. Our Community Hubs really buzzed in 2024. In Nyanga, we're happy to boast that we no longer only have a soccer team, but have last year adopted a rugby academy, led by none other than our amazing Hub Leader, Sakhumzi Vapi. In Parkwood, Candice has been doing a phenomenal job at offering educational support to our hub kids, we have not only seen an improvement in their school attendance, but it's reflected in their overall school results as well. On top of that Candice and her team established a prayer initiative in partnership with a High School plagued with gangsterism and have actively been praying for and alongside young people and teachers from the school. Our Prison and Enterprise team invested deeply into 40 people, and from this group 15 were selected to complete our Barista training. I'm grateful that we're able to communicate that 80% of the 40 beneficiaries, who were deemed unemployable, have now found meaningful employment and are now economically active.

In retrospect, I'm sure you'd agree with me that God truly displayed Himself as faithful, as we held onto the hope that we boldly professed. We're looking expectantly to 2025, and trust that these numbers will increase all the more, as we hope to leave a lasting Kingdom legacy that will provide a better for South Africa for ALL. A NOTE FROM OUR STREAM LEADERS



CREATIVE MISSION

This year has been a remarkable journey for the Creative Mission Team, expanding our reach and deepening our impact in communities across Cape Town and beyond. Through a combination of live events, school programs, church visits, holiday clubs and creative arts initiatives, we have engaged with over 14,000 young people, offering them hope, purpose, and a sense of belonging all while pointing them to Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We hosted multiple Higher events, including our second Higher Schools Week, where over 5,000 young people were reached. Hundreds attended our Friday night gatherings, with many making commitments to faith and a life with Jesus.

Our BLOOM events continued to flourish, providing spaces for young women to explore their identity and purpose in Jesus. With 4 events held throughout the year, we engaged over 350 girls and young women. This year's theme, You Were Made to Hold On, resonated deeply, empowering attendees to hold onto Hope in Jesus, community, and purpose.

Our Respect Me program expanded significantly, engaging over 2,000 young people across eight projects, tackling crucial topics like social media, consent, and healthy relationships. Genetik Sessions remained active in communities like Parkwood, Kraaifontein, and Kewtown, providing weekly creative workshops that inspire and equip young people.

The Genetik Sessions team also had 720 ongoing face to face engagement through these weekly Hub visits. Additionally, first Genetik Sessions camp saw 41 young people gather for a great day of team building and creative learning, the second camp gathered 50 young people for a day of mentorship and skills-building.

Through music, arts, and faith-driven initiatives, we are committed to reaching the hardest-to-reach and raising up a generation of young leaders who will transform their communities for the better.

COMMUNITY TRANSFORMATION



Our Community Hubs are safe spaces for young people to come and engage in fun-filled recreational activities, and educational support programs whilst also being developed in their faith. In the last year though we had many hurdles to overcome, we remained confident in God and as a result, we were privileged to see many of the young people we worked with accepting Jesus as saviour. On one occasion, our Nyanga team invited a group of Rugby boys and girls to a holiday program, as part of this program a short bible study and testimony session was coordinated by our partner church Pastor (Pastor Kwanele Yako) and at the end of it an Invitation was made all 21 of these young people responded and accepted Jesus into their lives.

In Jozi, our Hub coordinator started a program called Spiritual Fitness in which he gathered with a group of around 6-8 boys before school for some physical and spiritual enrichment. After going through the Gospel of John 6 of these young men had committed to Jesus and are now committed members of the youth ministry of our Partner Church. In Parkwood, we saw great success with our education program, where we again experienced a 100% pass rate thanks to the great support from one of our partners. In Kewtown, we worked with around 30-40 kids weekly through a soccer program and were able to spend time praying with them and sharing the word.

Through it all, God was with us and showed his hand in all our endeavours.

PRISONS & ENTERPRISE



The Prison and Enterprise stream provides a support system from prison, to reintegration, through to employment, offering long term care for each individual we work with. To enhance the Message Enterprise Program's ability to deliver on this mandate, we partnered with Fincoach Foundation and Common Good Foundation to offer the Job Journey course.

The course is centred on biblical understanding that work is part of God's plan. The content enables individuals to feel loved, accepted, develop confidence, and empower them with critical skills needed to become job ready in a rapidly changing world. We had 27 participants graduate from the Job Journey course and 19 from the barista course. 80% of graduates found meaningful employment at establishments such as Mugg & Bean, Xpresso Coffee, Krispy Kreme, Primi World, and Jean-Paul Hair Salon.

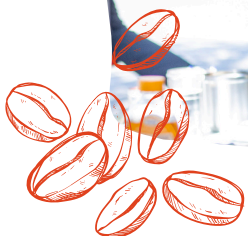
Have you visited our Gangstar Café in Mowbray recently? Our focus in 2024 was on the long-term sustainability and viability of the social enterprise operations. This necessitated the closing of our cafes in Durbanville and N1 City to upgrade our Mowbray operations and prepare for future growth and expansion. We invite you to come see the changes and get a taste of our daily specials.



At the end of 2024 there were four residents in the Oaks Discipleship house. Since then, two residents have transitioned out of the house. Both are working full-time which enabled them to move to the next phase of their reintegration journey. Please continue to pray for them as well as the two remaining residents who will be moving to the next phase early in 2025.

We thank the Lombard Insurance Chairman's fund for their donation towards renovations for the house. With these funds we addressed damp issues in the living room area and one of the bedrooms as well as an upgrade to the communal bathroom. We continue to seek corporates from the construction or property development industry to adopt the house as a CSI Project to assist us with other maintenance requirements in the house.

One listener shared how Chrissy T's music helped them embrace their God-given identity, with the song "Hold Your Crown" standing out as a favorite that embodies the message of identity.

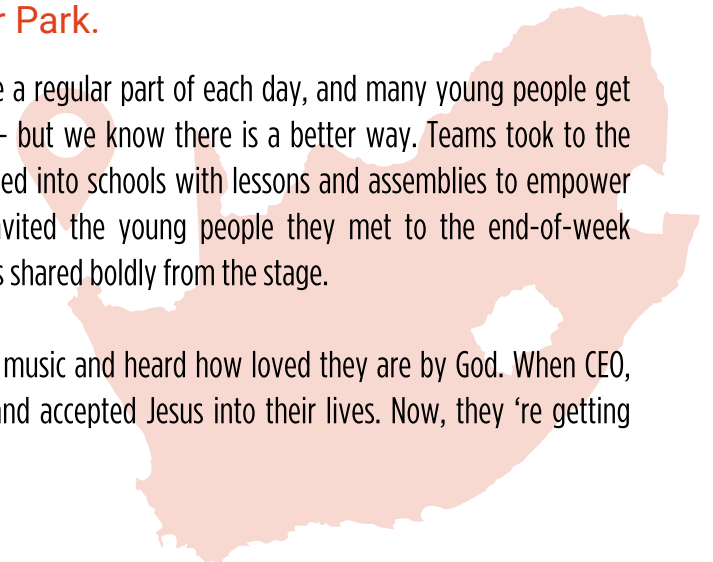
HOPE IN HANOVER PARK



Meeting with over 1,000 young people in one week, Message South Africa had an incredible Higher Tour in Hanover Park.

Hanover Park is an area where gangsterism and violence are a regular part of each day, and many young people get involved with this as a way to find community and safety – but we know there is a better way. Teams took to the streets to share the love of Jesus with those they met, headed into schools with lessons and assemblies to empower and equip young people to make healthy choices, and invited the young people they met to the end-of-week evangelistic concert where they could hear the gospel of Jesus shared boldly from the stage.

At the concert, 135 young people came along for truth-filled music and heard how loved they are by God. When CEO, Shaun Pretorius, shared the gospel, 21 people responded and accepted Jesus into their lives. Now, they're getting plugged into local discipleship alongside local churches.



JESUS IS THE WAY



Our Creative Missions team, along with our Academy students, hosted our annual Holiday Club in Citrusdal, a farm area in partnership with the Hebron Community Projects (HCP).

This year, in one of our annual missions trips to Citrusdal, we welcomed over 180 children from grades 1 to 7, along with 50 teens and their farm leaders. The theme for the week was “Jesus is the Way,” guiding our activities and interactions throughout the program.

The holiday club featured a variety of engaging activities, including themed crafts, deeper dives into the Word, games, and a massive sports day. We also incorporated Genetik Session workshops focusing on vocals, rap, poetry, and dance. One of the highlights of this year’s club was the active participation of local teens who, although not officially part of the program, recognized the importance of serving their younger peers. In a community where young people often face challenges related to drug and alcohol abuse, it was heartening to see these teens embrace their roles as positive role models while still enjoying the childlike spirit of the holiday club.



We concluded the week with an invitation for the kids to commit to “live with Jesus every day,” reinforcing our theme. To celebrate, we organized a concert for the parents, showcasing the incredible talent of the kids. Many parents left astonished by the hidden abilities of their children, further affirming the transformative power of our Holiday Club.



THE HIGHER TOUR GOES BACK TO PARKWOOD



The Higher Tour is an initiative that collaborates with local churches to organize large-scale evangelistic events aimed at reaching thousands of young people.

Through innovative schools work, gigs, and community initiatives, the Higher Tour spreads the message of hope and salvation to youth across various communities.

Earlier this year, the Higher Tour returned to Parkwood and during the week, our team took to the streets and headed into schools using music and testimonies as a platform to share the gospel and invited young people to a Friday night Higher concert! Over 200 young people gathered at the concert for an evening of engaging performances, testimonies and a gospel message and the young people were impacted by the love of Jesus Christ in a tangible way.

One of the most remarkable outcomes of the Higher Tour event in Parkwood was the significant number of young people who decided to respond to the gospel.

Witnessing lives transformed and hearts touched by the grace of God was a testament to the power of collective efforts and unwavering faith. The success of the Higher Tour event in Parkwood highlights the importance of community engagement and collaboration in spreading the gospel. By partnering with local churches and investing in innovative outreach strategies, the Higher Tour continues to make a lasting impact on the lives of young people, empowering them to embrace faith, hope, and redemption.

Our Parkwood Hub delivered a holiday club in July and it was a beautiful blend of joy, learning, and discipleship.

With the support of four volunteers and four assistant volunteers, we engaged the children in various activities, including artwork and interactive Bible sessions.

A memorable moment was when a Grade 7 child expressed curiosity about God after participating in an activity that involved filling in the different books of the Bible. Candice Lovelot, our Parkwood coordinator, shared her experience: “For my first-holiday club, I never expected so many children. They never wanted to go home unless they saw me leaving. The joy and laughter we shared was amazing. They asked me to have another holiday club and my goal was to teach them how to be anchored in Christ at a young age and to always have God in their boat, no matter the storms they face.”

This holiday club was more than just a series of activities; it was a safe place where children could experience God’s love and learn about His unwavering presence in their lives. The enthusiasm and eagerness of the kids to return highlighted the deep impact of the club. Seeing their eyes light up with joy and curiosity reminded us of the importance of our mission. We look forward to continuing this journey, providing an environment where young hearts can grow in faith and find hope amidst their challenges.

COMMUNITY TRANSFORMATION TURNS THE PAGE!



Community Transformation has seen one of their young boys from one of our Community Hubs turn the page!

Despite facing significant challenges at home this young boy's determination to succeed remains unwavering. A few years ago during an assessment of the reading age of some of our young people, it was discovered that many of them had reading ages that were 5-6 years younger than it was supposed to be.

Over the last 18 months, our team has been working tirelessly, in partnership with Youth In Transformation, to see change in the area of education. Many of our hub attendees, including this young person, face many hurdles and sometimes even arrive at school on an empty stomach. Yet, this young boy's difficult circumstances have not deterred him from striving for excellence.

Remarkably, this young person is the top student at our Community Hub in Parkwood, consistently achieving high marks with an impressive average of 7s every year. Just last term, he earned six certificates, a testament to his hard work and dedication.

This story is a powerful reminder of the strength and resilience of our young people and a testament to the team on the ground. Despite the adversity our young people face, they continue to excel academically and set an example for others. This journey underscores the impact of support and determination, proving that even in the toughest conditions, success is possible.



HOW OUR RESPECT ME TEAM IS TRANSFORMING LIVES IN SCHOOLS ACROSS CAPE TOWN

What a year it has been for the Respect Me team! As we reflect on our journey, we're thankful to be able to share some of our key highlights from 2024.

The Respect Me team kicked off the year with an exciting new partnership at Valpark Primary in Valhalla Park, venturing into an area where we had never worked before. The demand for our Girls Course has been nothing short of overwhelming. We listened to the needs of our community and responded with urgency, successfully delivering back-to-back sessions. So far, we've completed four Girls Course projects, impacting students in special needs schools and homes for pregnant teens and young women in crisis. It's been heartening to witness the resilience and strength of these learners as they engage with the program.

Our original goal for the year was to reach three new schools. We are thrilled to announce that we have exceeded that target by reaching eight new schools so far this year! Each new partnership has allowed us to connect with diverse communities, allowing us to engage with more young people than ever before. We've hosted three Respect Me-specific school assemblies this year, whilst these assemblies are an awesome way to encourage a whole school, they also serve as an introduction, helping learners and educators become familiar with our team and understand the purpose behind our programs.

As we approach another year, we are excited to keep this momentum going. We have plans to deliver our schools project at two new schools: Kewtown Primary and Vista Nova High. We're celebrating our successes while keeping our eyes on the future. This year has been a significant win for our team, and it's only the beginning. We're grateful for the support from our partner schools and the incredible learners who inspire us every day. Together, we're making a difference, one school at a time.



AN INSIDE SCOOP ON GANGSTAR CAFÉ, WHERE COFFEE BREWS CHANGE

At Gangstar Café, mornings begin long before our doors officially open at 7 a.m. As one of the first to arrive, I'm often met by the quiet stillness of the shop—a calm moment before the day begins.

My day at Gangstar Café begins with setting up the coffee machine, which takes about 15-20 minutes to heat up. Then, it's off to the kitchen to bake treats and prepare the café for customers. By 7 a.m., we're ready for our first regulars who grab a quick coffee before heading to work. The early morning vibe is my favourite, with people seeking either a caffeine boost or a peaceful moment before the day begins.

One common question is, "Gangstar? Are you all Gangsters?" I always share the story behind the name: "Gang is the past, but STAR is the future." Gangstar Café is about transformation—giving second chances and helping people like me find a place to shine. Customers often ask, "Does buying coffee here really make a difference?" and the answer is yes. Every cup supports ex-offenders as they rebuild their lives.

What I love most is the connections we make with people. Each cup of coffee is an opportunity to meet someone new or catch up with a familiar face. Coffee here is more than a drink; it's a bridge to new stories and a daily reminder that everyone deserves a fresh start. So, next time you're in the area, grab a cappuccino and be part of the change.

The Bloom Uganda event was a powerful moment in the movement, bringing even more young women together to stand for what is right. They were not just offered a day of fun but Christ Himself; Christ the ultimate and greatest Treasure. Christ their ever present help in time of need. Christ their maker and friend and the only one in whom their true identity is found. Great comfort was found in the realisation that there is Help and Hope on the uncertain path of life; Hope that we shall continue to fan through continued discipleship.

Training Youth Leaders Together Conference 2024: Empowering the Next Generation with Scripture Union Western Cape and The Message Trust South Africa.

SAKUMZI RUGBY SPRINTS TO VICTORY

Since its launch in 2019, the Nyanga Hub has been a source of hope and opportunity in the community, supporting young people through education and sport.

The Hub offers tutoring to equip students with the skills needed to succeed academically, while sports—especially soccer and rugby—serve as a powerful tool for engagement, relationship-building, and sharing the love of Jesus.

Through soccer teams, the Hub provides a safe space where young athletes not only improve their skills but also grow in character and faith. The Message Trust's partnership has been instrumental in making this impact possible, reflecting a deep commitment to serving the community.

A recent highlight was the 10s Rugby Tournament, where Nyanga Hub's team triumphed 31-12 over Primrose Nyanga. Avile, a standout player, showcased his speed and skill, helping secure the victory. His performance highlighted the values of teamwork, dedication, and perseverance that the Hub instills. The Nyanga Hub continues to be a force for change, offering education, sport, and community support to empower young people like Avile to thrive.

As Message we believe that God gave us a vision to "Expand into Africa", and in December 2024 we saw this become a reality.

After years of preparation, our African Development Director, Tim Tucker, led a team of 37 individuals to serve at the launch of Message Uganda. Nineteen of the individuals in this team were from South Africa, and three of the nineteen were from Message South Africa.

In the buildup to the festival, which took place from 12-14 December, the team served in various ways. We preached at local churches, had teams cleaning the streets in Bombo, hosted evangelism outreaches in different communities and we even hosted a football and netball tournament.

The festival itself was amazing, we had guest artists and speakers from all over the world serving within our team. We saw 8517 attendees at the festival and witnessed 748 recorded salvations. We're excited to see all God has planned for greater Africa... So watch this space!



ANNUAL FINANCIALS

NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

This financial report is a consolidation of the financial information for The Message Trust South Africa, Gangstar Enterprise Development and Message Africa, whose funds are held in trust, covering the period March 2024 to February 2025. The information is unaudited.

The year has been incredibly tight from a financial perspective with a decrease in income across the board resulting in a total income of R 6 875 912 compared to R 7 398 439 in 2023/2024. The Message Trust particularly has struggled with cashflow in the second half of the year, however, by the grace of God salaries were able to be paid every month so far. The end of the year reflected a small surplus of R 71 461 spread over the different entities as follows:

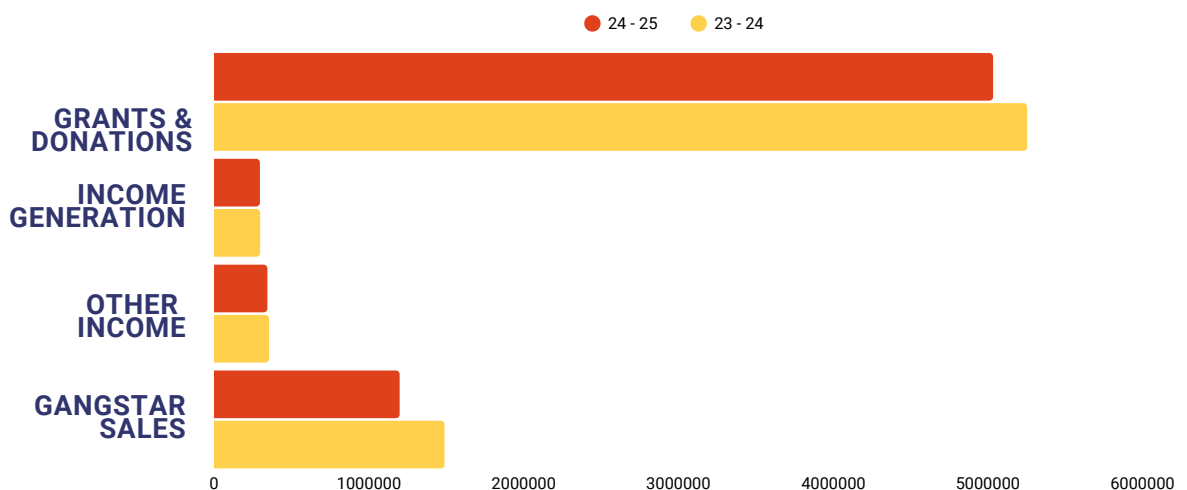
The Message Trust South Africa	- R 238 567 (deficit)
Gangstar Enterprise Development	R 221 190 (surplus)
Message Africa	R 88 838 (surplus)

Gangstar income includes a generous donation to purchase the coffee roastery from NuBean Café who have been operating on the Gangstar premises, enabling Gangstar to bring the roastery in-house, save on the purchase of coffee beans and add coffee bean sales as an income stream.

Total expenditure of R 6 804 451 has reduced by 7% from 2023/2024's R 7 323 158 despite the increasing cost of living. Through the finance and operation's team's careful control of spending the organisation has managed to keep expenditure below budget and within cash constraints.

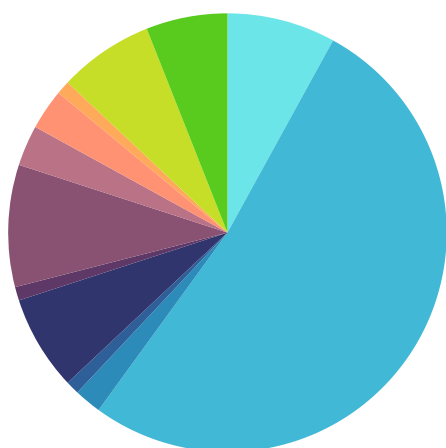
Following the employment of Grant Irlam as Finance Officer mid-way through the year, it was possible to bring the bookkeeping and financial management in-house, saving costs on outsourced support. Grant and the finance team have significantly improved the accuracy of the financial information and timely preparation of useful reports providing a clear picture of the financial position.
